MONETARILY MONTHLY SPECIAL OFFERINGS WERE CROSSROADS (FORT WAYNE CHILDREN'S HOME), CUE SEMINARIES, ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING, GOOD NEWS MINISTRIES, ELLENBERGER EMERGENCY FUND, STRENGTHEN THE CHURCH, HORIZON HOUSE, ICAN, STRENGTHEN OUR CHURCH (ELLENBERGER) NEIGHBORS IN NEED, FAMILY IN NEED, AND THE CRISTMAS FUND – VETERANS OF THE CROSS. THROUGHOUT THE YEAR WE JOINED IN COLLECTING ITEMS TO MATERIALLY ASSIST OTHERS IN NEED. IN RESPONSE TO THE JANUARY EARTHQUAKE IN HAITI, WE PARTICIPATED IN CHURCH WORLD SERVICES HEALTH AND BABY KIT DRIVE. CONCERN FOR THE WORLD'S CHILDREN HAD US PACKING SHOEBOXES FOR CHRISTMAS GIFTS AS PART OF SAMARITANS PURSE OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD. NEEDS CLOSER TO HOME SPURRED COLLECTING AND FILLING BACKPACKS FOR HOMELESS PEOPLE, AND OF COURSE, OUR EVER-POPULAR SCHOOL SUPPLIES FOR SCHOOL 88. WORLD HUNGER GOT US ON OUR FEET RAISING MONEY AND WALKING IN CROP WALK. LOCAL HUNGER CALLED US TO BRING DONATED FOOD TO THE COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY (IRV HERMAN TAKES A LOAD THERE WEEKLY). CONTRIBUTIONS PLACED IN THE "BOOT" HELPS TO SUPPORT MARILU IN ECUADOR. CAN POP TABS ARE COLLECTED FOR RILEY HOSPITAL. CAMPBELL SOUP LABELS, OLD EYEGASSES AND USABLE CLOTHING WERE AMONG OUR CONTINUING COLLECTIONS. TO PUT A "FACE" TO SOME OF OUR LOCAL MISSION WORK WE HAVE "ADOPTED" A FAMILY-IN-NEED. THIS FAMILY IS AND WILL BE THE SPECIFIC RECIPIENTS OF SOME OF SOME OF OUR COLLECTIONS. OUR THANKSGIVING BASKET PROVIDED FOR A FEAST FOR THIS FAMILY, AND CHRISTMAS GIFTS WERE GIVEN FOR EVERY MEMBER OF THE FAMILY. NOMINALLY UNDER THE MISSION UMBRELLA WAS CREATIVE CORNERS WITH ITS HIGHLIGHTS OF THE HOLIDAY BAZAAR.

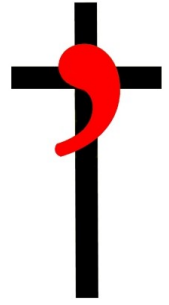
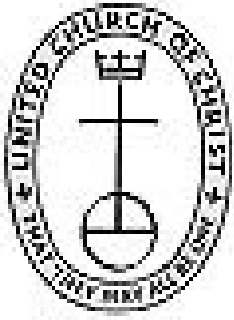
